Epistle Reading

Prokeimenon. Plagal Second Mode. Psalm 27.9,1. O Lord, save your people and bless your inheritance. Verse: To you, O Lord, I have cried, O my God.

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians 6:11-18

Brethren, see with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that would compel you to be circumcised, and only in order that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. For even those who receive circumcision do not themselves keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may glory in your flesh. But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. Peace and mercy be upon all who walk by this rule, upon the Israel of God. Henceforth let no man trouble me; for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

Gospel Reading John 3:13-17

The Lord said, "No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of man who is in heaven. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life." For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

Message From Fr. Michael....

Dearly Beloved Faithful in the Lord:

As we reflect upon the events of September 11th, 2001, we are forever scarred by those tragic memories. Over three thousand innocent men, women, and children were suddenly deprived of God's gift of life. The Twin Towers which once stood as an icon of American financial success were turned into dust and rubble in 102 minutes. A cowardly terrorist act of that event has adversely affected not only America but the entire world. The liberty we once knew has been affected. Security measures have become more intrusive in the lives of the private citizen, as a result of this tragedy. The world will never be the same again. The victims of 9/11 are God's people who are returning back to their Creator! The enemy has been defeated as he has not taken our faith, our hope, or our love. Therefore, God and His people remain victorious! Remember, no one can take away your faith unless you allow them to do so! As we reflect upon this 21st anniversary of 9/11, please pray for the victims of this tragedy and their families. May their memory be eternal!

They are God's property and no evil force can take away from God what rightfully belongs to Him unless the People of God allow for that.
